


Safeguarding in light of the Care Act: Leaders' briefing

Around 155 Safeguarding Adults Reviews (SARs) have been commissioned or conducted in the two years following the implementation of the *Care Act 2014*. The Act states that SARs should promote 'effective learning and improvement action to prevent future deaths or serious harm occurring again' (14.164).
